
I'M WORRIED ABOUT A CHILD IN SCHOOL.

If you are concerned about the welfare of a pupil in school, please speak with Miss Minnis (Designated Teacher for Child Protection)



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It is a profoundly simple but effective concept, which any primary or nursery school can implement completely free of charge and without the need for staff training.

Its impact can be transformational – improving not only the children's fitness, but also their concentration levels, mood, behaviour and general wellbeing.

The Daily Mile is a social activity, wherein the children run or jog – at their own pace – in the fresh air with friends. Children can occasionally walk to catch their breath, if necessary, but should aim to run or jog for the full 15 minutes. Our Primary 7 pupils have been trialing this concept for us here at Victoria – out running 1 mile every morning for the last two weeks. Keep your eye out for other classes joining in. 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Does your child have a mobile phone / tablet?

Do they have internet access?

Are you 100% sure of what each app on the phone is?

In my last newsletter I made parents / carers aware of a few different apps that they should be looking out for on their child's mobile phone or tablet. An app that has recently come to my attention that was not on this list is an app called **IMVU** – this is an online virtual reality app that allows people to chat anonymously online. Can I ask that you check devices for this app too.

I would also have a conversation with your child to inform them that when online, if they come across anything that they believe is 'not right' websites will have the Report Abuse button or Report It button for children to use.





The PSNI recently came into school to speak with our P7 children about being safe online. The officers commented to me at the end of the sessions about how well behaved the children had been and later mentioned how impressed they felt on the PSNI Facebook Page.
